Now there's even more excitement at the Community Marketplace! You can buy **raffle tickets** for one or both of these great items:

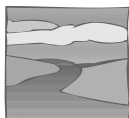
- ✦ a fabulous basket of Washington Wines valued at over \$150

We have two food barrels in the foyer from the Second Harvest Food Bank of Spokane. **Please take this opportunity to make a difference in the lives of local families and seniors.** Every can of food you donate feeds hope for the hungry in Spokane. Food collected helps stock 20 emergency food outlets in Spokane County that serve more than 15,000 people every month. **Four out of 10 emergency food clients are children and one out of 10 is a senior.** Each dollar you give is transformed into six pounds of food — about four meals. Checks can be dropped at the Office.

- ORANGE → OFFER fair and kind treatment to all.
- YELLOW → YEARN to learn throughout life and accept our differences.
- GREEN → GROW by exploring ideas and values together.
- BLUE → BELIEVE in our ideas and act on them.
- INDIGO → INSIST on peace, freedom and justice for all.
- VIOLET → VALUE our interdependence with nature.
