Julia Ward Howe's *Mother's Day Proclamation* conceptualized the first North American Mother's Day in 1870. Despite having penned *The Battle Hymn of the Republic* 12 years earlier, Howe became intensely distraught by the death and carnage of the Civil War. In her proclamation, Howe called on mothers to come together and protest what she saw as the futility of their sons killing the sons of other mothers, and called for an international Mother's Day celebrating peace and motherhood.
